Twenty-nine boys learned various life skills and values through Boy Scouts - Blackhawk Area Council.

NICAA Golden Meals delivered nutritious meals to 18 seniors.

VOICES Domestic Violence Program provided support and advocacy to seven victims of domestic violence.

Four income-eligible individuals received free civil legal assistance from Prairie State Legal Services.

Sojourn House's treatment programs and counseling services helped eight individuals overcome addictions.

Two children received tutoring and life-skills activities from the Boys and Girls Club of Freeport and Stephenson County.

Regional Access and Mobilization Project (RAMP) provided advocacy and services for nine individuals with disabilities so they could maintain independent living.

Five at-risk boys and girls gained a new friend when they were matched with a Big Brother, Big Sister, or classroom mentor, a program of FHN Family Counseling Center.

Assault and Abuse Services of Stephenson County provided support, intervention, education, and counseling to two victims of sexual assault.

Senior Resource Center delivered information and follow-up to 61 seniors to assist them in maintaining an adequate income in retirement.

New Horizons Counseling Center provided direction and hope to three individuals through their counseling services.
